

Propane Heaters Safety Precautions

- Do not use this heater in a space where gasoline or other liquids having flammable vapors are stored or used. Use in well ventilated area
- 2. Propane is highly flammable. In the event of a leak, propane will accumulate and the possibility of a fire is present. This gas is scented and its strong odor is readily detectable. Never strike a match, bring any flame or create an electric spark in an enclosure when you smell it. Ventilate the area thoroughly, move the heater outside, and correct the leak before attempting to light again.
- Always connect the heater to propane cylinder in the outdoors or in a well ventilated area. NEVER connect this heater near an open flame
- 4. Always operate heater with propane cylinder in an upright position on a level non-combustible surface. NEVER place cylinder on its side when operating the heater
- 5. Do no attempt to operate the heater with any other gas than that indicated on the heater nameplate
- 6. Do not touch any part of the heater while in operation or shortly after it has been turned off as severe burn may occur to skin. Allow at least 20 minutes for cooling before handling and storing. Detach propane cylinder from heater before storing. Do not store propane cylinders near open flame or heat.



7. Make sure sufficient fresh outside air is provided according to the heater requirements. Direct combustion heaters should only be used in well vented areas in order to avoid carbon monoxide poisoning
